Catalog Course Description

This course is an examination of the origin, development, and organization of the Juvenile Justice System as it evolved in the American Justice System. The course explores the theories that focus on Juvenile Law, courts and processes, and the constitutional protections extended to juveniles administered in the American Justice System. 54 lecture hours.

Course Objectives

- Critically analyze and describe the juvenile justice system and its context in the criminal justice system.
- Apply California laws pertaining to juvenile delinquency and dependency to case studies.
- Critically distinguish between delinquency, status offenses, and dependency.
- Critically analyze the distinctions between the adult and juvenile justice systems.
- Critically evaluate Constitutional protections extended to juveniles through judicial decisions.
- · Critically appraise the Juvenile Court dispositions.
