Catalog Course Description

This course explores basic techniques of pottery making. It may include aspects of handbuilding and throwing on the potter's wheel. Emphasis is on understanding the qualities of clay, appreciation of basic pottery forms, glazing techniques and the development of personal expression. Historical and cultural concerns in ceramics are included. Material fee. 36 lecture hours, 72 lab hours.

Course Objectives

- Produce and critique pottery forms using ten different basic handbuilding and throwing techniques
- · Understand the nature of glaze and be able to apply it to simple forms
- Decorate simple pieces using four wet clay decorating techniques
- Research ideas for class projects through use of library materials and the internet
- · Recognize and describe the origin and qualities of clay and glaze
- · Recognize and appreciate the role of handcrafts in today's society
