Catalog Course Description

Personalized exploration of expressive painting concepts and techniques in oil and acrylic paint. Includes critical examination of paintings for technical and aesthetic concerns, content, and historical/cultural influences. 36 lecture hours, 72 lab hours.

Course Objectives

- Apply understanding of color theory, value and composition toward development of a chosen painting direction.
- Explain the relationship between form and content in students' own work.
- Analyze paintings for concept (abstract, realistic, symbolic, etc.) and style.
- Participate in critical analysis of paintings, to include discussion of technical concerns, form and content (meanings to include emotive, theoretical, cultural, historical, etc.) and contexts.

Major Course Content

This course will continue the development begun in ART 130 and 131, through a more directed personalized approach.

Additional study will emphasize:

- 1. Greater Facility with Chosen Painting Medium.
- 2. Greater Understanding of How Color, Value, Composition and Other Aspects of Form Relate to Content.
- 3. Extension and Incorporation of Knowledge of Past and Contemporary Painting Concerns in Relation to Desired Painting Direction.
- 4. Further Development of Critical Facility to Include Analysis Of:
 - a. Aesthetic criteria
 - b. Technical concerns
 - c. Art historical and theoretical concerns
 - d. Cultural and other meaning involved in content
