Catalog Course Description

This course is a continuation of BARB 101 and focuses on men's haircutting techniques using shears, razors, clippers and trimmers. The course will include fades, tapers, clipper-cuts, clipper-over-comb, and scissor-over-comb techniques for wet and dry hair as well as hairstyling, skin analysis, and an introduction to basic facial and shaving techniques. 120 lecture hours, 120 lab hours.

Course Objectives

- Perform short haircuts using shears, clippers, trimmers, and a razor.
- Identify diseases and disorders of the skin.
- Perform a basic facial.
- Identify the 14 shaving areas of the face.
- Demonstrate the positions and strokes of shaving.
- Explain the options for hair replacement.
