Catalog Course Description

This course will cover children's acquisition of speech and language skills from birth to age five. Emphasis will be on normal language, articulation, fluency, and voice development. Included will be children's language learning strategies, adult teaching strategies, language and cultural differences, and an overview of communication disorders, as well as appropriate referral to a professional. 36 lecture hours.

Course Objectives

- compare two or more theories of language acquisition
- describe the sequence of normal language development from birth to 5 years
- identify potential problems in a child's speech and/or language development and follow through with a referral to a professional if necessary
- implement two or more developmentally appropriate language teaching strategies
