CM 698C – Cooperative Education is intended to fulfill fieldwork experience (hands-on) requirements, which consist of no less than 180 hours volunteer employment in an approved construction company, consultant firm or public agency. The student must hold a position equivalent to an internship or higher, which affords the opportunities usually given to an entry-level position. Field work must be completed prior to graduation and must be approved by the CM program director. 180 lab hours arranged.
