Catalog Course Description

This is part 2 of the introductory course for students majoring in cosmetology and/or hairstyling. The course is a continuation of the theoretical and practical instruction in a variety of subjects including health & safety, disinfection & sanitation, infection control, scalp care, trichology, basic haircutting, and basic hairstyling. 60 lecture hours and 40 lab hours.

Course Objectives

- Consult and correctly recognize and identify hair and scalp conditions/treatments.

- Demonstrate proper safety and sanitation procedures using correct chemical agents when sanitizing tools.
- Comprehend the importance of communication and interpersonal skills for a service driven industry.
