Covers the historic development of recreation and the role of the federal, state and local government in outdoor recreation. Other topics include economic impact, supply and demand, private enterprise, education, planning and management within the realm of recreation. 54 lecture hours.

Examples of Required Writing Assignments

Answer a short essay question on an exam such as: Thoughtful planning is the best ingredient in trail layout, but unfortunately for managers, people do not always react as they are expected to react. Because of this, managers quite often follow the practice of "path paving." What is "path paving"? In your discussion, include the drawbacks that are present when a manager uses this technique.

Examples of Outside Assignments

Campground Presentations

Purpose: The United States Forest Service needs to produce a campground in our local mountains. Individual groups (4 to 5 students) will produce a PowerPoint presentation (saved on a flash drive) in the form of a proposal on a "FOREST CAMPGROUND" and all site specifics that will be occur in the Angeles National Forest within the San Gabriel Mountains.

Goal: Each group will need to convince the class (which is pretending to be the US Forest Service) that their proposal is the "best" campground plan that meets the requirements, regulations and cost for the federal government.

Location: The campground must be located within the Los Angeles National Forest in either the San Gabriel Canyon or Mt San Antonio Canyon.

Specifics: Presentation will be 20 – 30 slides long and contain a title slide, table of content slide, body slides, and reference slide. The presentation should be ~ 20 minutes long with a 10-15 minute question/answer session afterward. All group members will need to participate during the formation of and the presentation itself.

Presentations will need to include all aspects of campground construction, campsite specificity, amenities, management, locality, laws, community involvement, and cost analysis.

All research materials/literature/photographs/references used during the presentation will need to be cited.
