Catalog Course Description

A course in elementary French grammar, vocabulary, and pronunciation which focuses on understanding, speaking, reading, and writing simple French and serves as an introduction to the geography, history, and culture of the French-speaking world. 90 lecture hours.

Course Objectives

- ask and answer questions and maintain a simple conversation in areas of immediate need and on very familiar topics
- · pronounce French well enough to be intelligible to native speakers
- understand, with some repetition, simple questions and statements
- $\boldsymbol{\cdot}\,$ read and understand the information presented in a simple paragraph
- write a short paragraph on a familiar topic using standard French grammar
- respond appropriately to everyday situations in French culture such as greeting, leave-takings, buying food, and asking directions
- understand French practices and perspectives available only through France and its cultures
