A further study of the elementary French grammar and vocabulary which develops understanding, speaking, reading, and writing skills. Includes additional study of French culture. 90 lecture hours.

- understand the essential points of a simple narrative or an explanation delivered at slow to moderate speed
- · read and comprehend factual information of low difficulty

- handle routine social situations in French cultures, showing an understanding of common rules of how individuals behave towards one another
