Catalog Course Description

An exploration of the cultural development and role of the African-American in the history of the United States from the end of the Reconstruction period (1876) to the present. 54 lecture hours.

Course Objectives

- demonstrate an understanding of the cultural heritage of African Americans
- identify the contributions which African American peoples and institutions have made in the development of the nation
- deploy and analyze evidence regarding the nature and impact of racism in the culture, society, and politics of the post-1876 United States
- identify various persons, groups, philosophies, and other factors that contributed to the successes and limits of the Civil Rights Movement and to later movements for racial equality
- demonstrate an understanding of how African American experiences have changed since 1965, including how popular culture shapes perceptions of Black culture
