An overview of British culture and civilization that considers the history, politics, economics, culture, and social changes that have formed contemporary British society. 54 lecture hours.

Course Objectives

- Identify key aspects of contemporary British cultures and society, within a historical context.
- Demonstrate critical comparisons between what they observe and learn about British society and their home culture and society.
- Appraise and relate key cultural and historical sites in London to their historical and cultural context.
