## Examples of Required Writing Assignments

DEGREE APPLICABLE COURSE: 2 hours of independent work done out of class per each hour of lecture or class work, or 3 hours lab, practicum, or the equivalent, per unit.

## Examples of Outside Assignments

Over an 18 week presentation of the course three hours per week are required for each unit of credit. Two hours of independent work done out

of class are required for each lecture. Student will be required to complete the following types of assignments outside of the regular class time: Complete the minimum hours of work, based on the formula of one semester unit for 75 hours per term of paid work or 60 hours per term of volunteer work.
