Catalog Course Description

The Professional Performance Techniques for the musician class provides the musician with the necessary fundamentals, to accurately assess a performance setting and make appropriate decisions for its success. The course stresses detailed style analysis in a broad range of musical settings. Logistical necessities will be examined and the course will culminate with musical performances. 18 lecture hours, 108 lab hours arranged.

- demonstrate proper judgment in the analysis of the components necessary for a successful performance
- demonstrate proper judgment in decision making pertaining to performance logistics
- · execute a broad range of musical styles

- negotiate logistical maneuvers pertaining to a professional performance
- demonstrate knowledge of the artist's role in a structure performance setting

 - i. strategy execution (delivery of plan, plan modifications)
 - Performers' responsibilities (time management techniques, material selection techniques, attire options, attitude techniques)
