Course Objectives

- understand and successfully demonstrate elements of concert planning such as theme selection, music choices, staging and lighting techniques, performance and ensemble/talent support, crew development and techniques, equipment functions, attire choices, time line comprehension and training.
- understand and successfully demonstrate elements of concert promotion such as budget concepts, crew/support techniques, time line comprehension, demographics and their tendencies and training.
- understand and successfully demonstrate elements of concert touring such as planning and travel techniques, budget comprehension, talent and crew techniques and itinerary concepts and techniques

Major Course Content

- Touring concepts and techniques: Various touring methods, travel options, budget analysis, talent and crew maintenance, itinerary concepts, planning
