Catalog Course Description

Continuation of materials and skills developed in MUSE 102. Additional study and analysis including diatonic seventh chords, secondary/applied chords, non-chord tones and period forms. Required of all music majors. 54 lecture hours.

Course Objectives

- · explain basic chordal notations and harmonic vocabulary
- use chords and seventh chords and their inversions in common harmonic progressions
- perform Roman numeral analysis of selected Bach chorales and other masterworks including diatonic triads and seventh chords in all inversions and non-chord tones
- · realize figured bass chord notation
- write a short musical example using standard compositional techniques
- · recognize various types of cadences and diagram period forms

Written analysis of harmonic, melodic, and structural components of musical compositions.

Examples of Outside Assignments

Compose a 16-measure choral-style composition in an SATB style based on standard harmonic, melodic and structural components using triads and 7th chords. Include examples of root position, 1st, 2nd and 3rd inversions of 7th chords. Activate the texture with correctly utilized non-chord tones: passing tones, neighbor tones, appoggiaturas, escape tones, suspensions and anticipations.
