Catalog Course Description

Continuation of MUSE 104 Harmony II, including seventh chords, secondary dominants, modality, harmonic structure of the phrase, harmonization of a given part, harmonic rhythm, irregular resolutions of secondary dominants, analysis of melodies, short works for piano, chorales, and songs. Required of all transferring music majors. 54 lecture hours.

Course Objectives

- demonstrate familiarity with advanced chordal notations and harmonic vocabulary
- · harmonize a given melody in a four-part texture
- · recognize harmonic structure within a given phrase
- · analyze selected works for piano, chorales and songs
- recognize and utilize advanced harmonic materials such as altered chords, modality/modal mixture, secondary mediants, borrowed chords, chord extensions, Neapolitan and augmented -sixth chords

- 2. Intermediate to advanced three and four-part writing and analysis
- 3. Review of seventh chords
- 4. Seventh chords first, second, third inversion
- 5. Review cadences, review modes
- 6. Harmonization of a given melody

- 8. Cadences, all major and minor keys
- 9. Irregular resolutions
- 10. Harmonic rhythm
- 11. Chromaticism, secondary mediants and other borrowed chords
- 12. Altered chords including 9th, 11th, and 13th chords
- 13. Modality and modal mixture
- 14. Song analysis and overview of other larger forms
- 15. Neapolitan and augmented-sixth chords: Italian, French and German
