Catalog Course Description

This course provides a review of intermediate vocal techniques and introduces the first processes of advanced level instruction. Vocal exercises include extension of range, stylistic analysis, and repertoire development used in performing literature for the solo voice. Performance is required. 36 lecture hours, 18 lab hours arranged.

Course Objectives

- demonstrate knowledge of vocal exercises and purposes
- demonstrate a variety of vocal repertoires (including classical)
- demonstrate articulate speech skills as they relate to singing performance
- demonstrate proficiency in intermediate to advanced level of solo performance practices

7. Repeated Performance Examinations
8. Classical Repertoire Development
9. More Advanced Skills Related to Successful Singing
10. Selection of Pieces for Final Performance
11. Analysis and Preparation for Final Performance
12. Final Performance

Hours Arranged Content

1. Stage rehearsal techniques
2. Additional rehearsals of course work prepared for performances

3. Combine with other voice classes to develop harmony skills
4. Public performance
