Catalog Course Description

Musical Theatre Academy Techniques course provides students with beginning to intermediate level vocal training, dance technique, and acting skills needed to perform. The course culminates in a final showcase which allows each student the training, experience, and exposure of performing for a live audience. 54 lecture hours, 26 lab hours.

Course Objectives

- Demonstrate knowledge of the vocabulary and the intermediate development of proper vocal production and good musicianship.
- Demonstrate knowledge of techniques and qualities of commercial dance technique at the beginning to intermediate level.
- · Demonstrate knowledge of the intermediate elements of acting.
- Demonstrate performance skill improvement at the intermediate level through public performance.
- Demonstrate intermediate level knowledge of music style and interpretation through performance.
