Catalog Course Description

Training and performance in solos, trios and small ensembles from the light opera and operatic repertoire. Introduction to standard literature, languages/diction, staging, and performance of this repertoire in scenes or in full opera productions. 18 lecture hours, 54 lab hours.

Course Objectives

- demonstrate familiarity with small ensembles from the operatic repertoire
- attain analytical ability to recognize and compare repertoire and vocal styles
- develop operatic performance ability appropriate to the individual's voice category

Major Course Content

- 1. Review of Operatic Vocal Techniques
- 2. Audition Technique for Opera Roles
- 3. Assignment of Roles and Ensembles
- Rehearsals with Separate Ensembles and any Full Group Work-Music Learning
- 5. Rehearsal-Learning Notes, Rhythms, and Harmonies
- 6. Begin Staging Rehearsals
- 7. Staging/blocking Rehearsals and Cleaning
- 8. View Videos of Various Operas, Continue Staging
- 9. Attend Live Opera Performance, Continue Staging
- 10. Finish Staging, Begin Running Dress Rehearsals
- 11. Public Performances Scheduled in the Community and/or on Campus

Lab Content

- 1. Rehearsal of separate ensembles and any full group work
- 2. Reviewing notes, harmonies, and rhythms
- 3. Begin staging rehearsals
- 4. Staging/blocking rehearsals and cleaning
- 5. Finish staging, run dress rehearsals
