Catalog Course Description

Open to all students capable of sustaining a vocal harmony part at an advanced level. Instruction in choral literature for the large choral ensemble. Special attention is given to choral tone production, phrasing and interpretation. Fundamental sight singing, solfege, and music theory will be covered. Participation in public performances is required. This course may be taken four times. 54 lecture hours, 18 lab hours arranged.

Course Objectives

- Demonstrate understanding of requirements for choral competition in the music industry
- Demonstrate skills in aesthetic awareness complementary to professional choral performance
- Apply techniques of choral blend, musicianship, professionalism, intonation, and sight-reading skills to actual live performance.

- 5. Development of Competitive Choral Skills
- 6. Soloist vs. Ensemble Analysis
- 7. Selection of Repertoire for Competition
- 8. Evaluation of Skill Set Progress
- 9. Analysis of Competition Requirements

- 2. Role-Play Small Ensemble Competitions
- 3. Performances in Choral Competitions

Suggested Reading Other Than Required Textbook

Memorization of vocal scores.

Musical analysis of vocal interpretation, phrasing, breath marks, pronunciation, text analysis, etc. of performance scores.
