Catalog Course Description

An introductory course of skin care treatments, hair removal, make-up application, anatomy, and physiology. This course also includes massage techniques, sanitation and disinfecting, disease and disorders of the skin, cosmetic chemistry, electrical current, and modalities for skin care. The course focuses on the basic skills required to achieve a State Board License. 72 lecture hours, 216 lab hours.

Course Objectives

- Analyze and understand skin types.
- Understand and comprehend the principles of electrical current.
- Prepare and apply chemical products in a safe manner.
- Safely and correctly use electrical modalities.
- Understand disinfecting procedures and properly generate solutions.
- Correctly choose products for specific skin types.
- Demonstrate knowledge of skin disease and disorders.
- Demonstrate proper comedone extraction techniques.
- Properly enter, record, and file client information and card.
- Demonstrate correct phone and front desk etiquette.
- Show knowledge and understanding of reactions to epidermal and dermal layers.
- Utilize professional make-up techniques and applications.
- Safely demonstrate removal of hair.
- Demonstrate various massage techniques.
- Correctly feather and apply false lashes.
- Demonstrate proper bed preparation.
