#### **Catalog Course Description**

A further exploration of the skills developed in Stage and Screenwriting 204 A and B. Focus is on writing Act III of a full-length play or screenplay and creating a dramatic story with a fully realized beginning, middle and end. 54 lecture hours, 18 lab hours.

#### **Course Objectives**

- Objectively track plot structure as it navigates through the original text from beginning to end.
- Continue to analyze and adjust the working relationship between plot and character in original work.
- Continue to analyze and adjust the progression of obstacles.
- · Continue to analyze and adjust the progression of dramatic tension.
- Continue to analyze and adjust how the story is progressing through believable dialogue.
- · Further enrich character depth.

### **Major Course Content**

- 1. Use Stage and Screenwriting terminology and concepts with greater clarity.
- 2. Explore 'consequences' of character actions and choices.
  - a. If characters had made different choices, how would the story be affected?
- 3. Build upon Plot and other forms of Dramatic Progression.
  - a. Clarify and adjust the 'A' 'B' 'C' storyline towards resolution
  - b. Conflict resolution
  - c. Changes in character point of view
- 4. Combine Rising Action, Climax and Crisis with Denouement.
- 5. Plays and Screenplays full-length
- 6. Continue to clarify believable dialogue that is 'speakable'.

#### **Lab Content**

- 1. Observing live performances
- 2. Observing filmed performances focusing on the progression from Act I Act III.
- Maintaining an in-class written journal focusing on script changes and progression.
- Writing exercises with specific focus on scenes from original work for changes or clarity.

# **Examples of Required Writing Assignments**

Act III of a full-length play or screenplay including dialogue, stage directions, act breaks and character breakdown is required.

#### **Examples of Outside Assignments**

reading the text observing various films journal writing with focus on script changes and progression formatting their Act III of a full-length play or screenplay
