Catalog Course Description

An exploration of Shakespeare's plays and poetry through scene study, monologues, rehearsal, and performance. This course aims to introduce a process and technique for analyzing play scripts and poetry for performance. 54 lecture hours, 18 lab hours.

Course Objectives

- Demonstrate an understanding of scansion as an interpretive analysis of the verse.
- Perform a sonnet, scene and monologue using classical acting techniques as introduced in class.
- Demonstrate the ability to read, discuss and analyze the imagery and vocabulary of a Shakespearean play.
