

# ADT IN SOCIAL JUSTICE STUDIES

The ADT in Social Justice Studies is intended to meet the lower division requirements for various Social Science majors (or similar majors) at a CSU for students interested in baccalaureate programs in Social Justice, Ethnic Studies, Women or Gender Studies, or programs focused on ethnic groups such as Chicano/Latino Studies, African American Studies, Asian American Studies, or Native American Studies. Social Justice Studies explores the experiences of individuals from different interdisciplinary studies of different groups and the complex relations and phenomena of culture, power, oppression, equity, and equality from the perspective of what is fair and just.

This degree is designed to appeal to the student who is interested in learning about the experiences of marginalized groups and those going into majors such as: Sociology, History, Political Science, Women's Studies, Race and Ethnic Studies.

\*Students are advised to check with the Counseling Department for the courses accepted into the various majors that fall under the umbrella of "Social Justice" at four-year institutions where they seek transfer.

## Learning Outcomes

### A.A.-Transfer Degree Level Student Learning Outcomes

Students completing the Social Justice Studies A.A.-Transfer Degree will:

1. Students will be able to identify and analyze the causes of race and gender inequality in the United States.
2. Students will identify and analyze social policies that have the potential to alleviate race and gender inequalities.

## Requirements

Students receiving this transfer degree must meet the following requirements:

1. Completion of 60 semester units or 90 quarter units that are eligible for transfer to the California State University, including both of the following:
  - a. The California General Education Transfer Curriculum (Cal-GETC) (<https://catalog.citruscollege.edu/programs-study/graduation-requirements-associate-degree/general-education-requirements-transfer-calgetc-option-ii/>).
  - b. A minimum of 18 semester units or 27 quarter units in a major or area of emphasis, as determined by the community college district.
2. Obtainment of a minimum grade point average of 2.0.
3. Meet the 12-unit residency requirement.

ADTs also require that students must earn a "C" (or "P") or better in all courses required for the major or area of emphasis.
